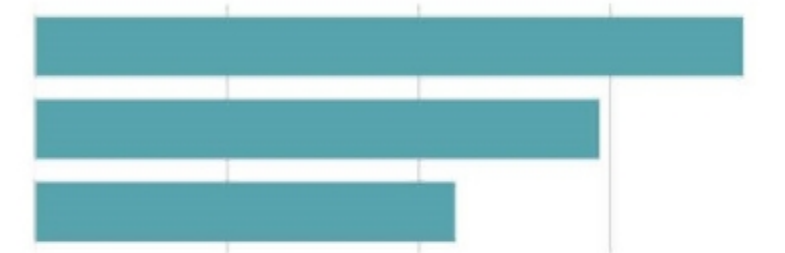

5. Are you a new student or continuing student?



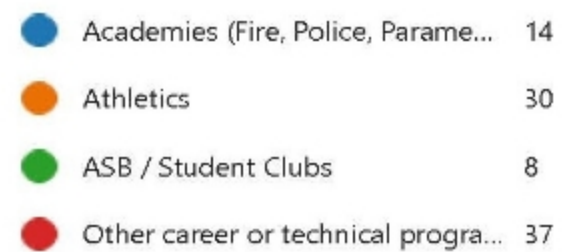
6. Are you a full time or part time student?



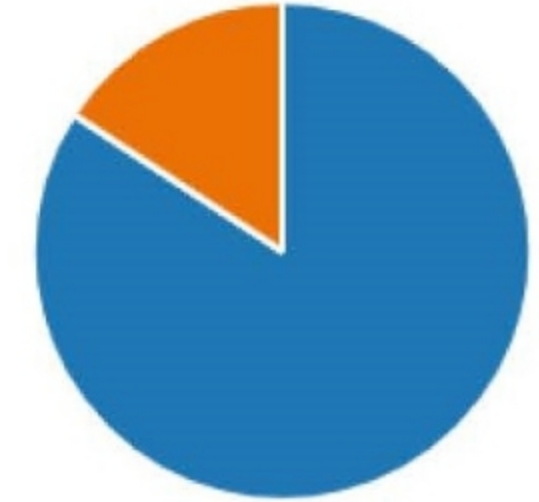
7. Please describe your current employment status



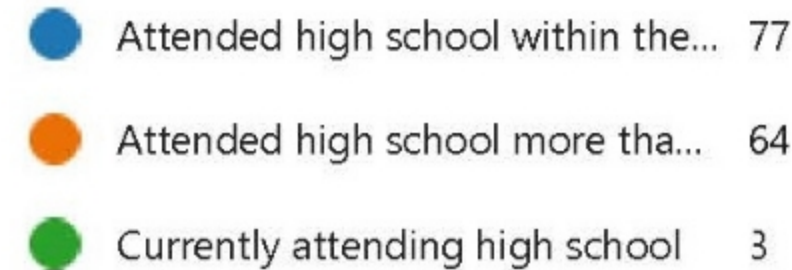
8. Please select all groups that you're a part of

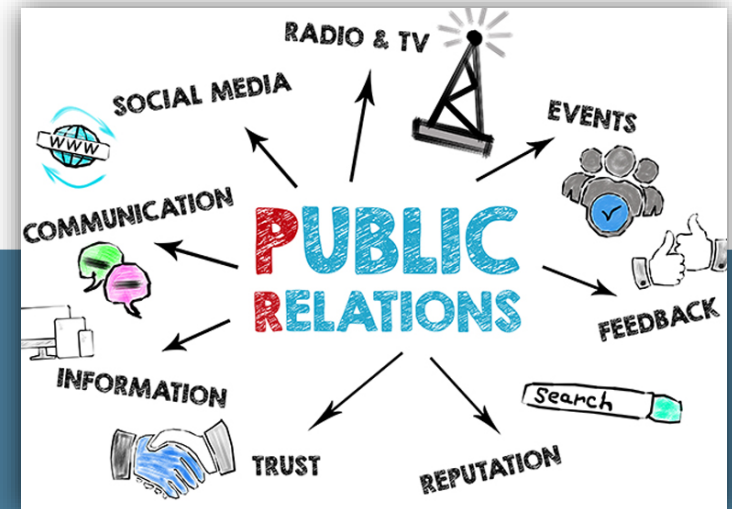



# Office of Administrative Services

## GOVERNOR'S BUDGET PROPOSAL

---

- Increases in many areas, including
  - Ongoing
    - COLA (8.13%)
    - \$90 million for COLAs and adjustments to certain categorical programs
    - \$28.8 million for systemwide enrollment growth of 0.5%
  - One Time
    - Student retention and enrollment efforts
    - \$143.8 million in capital outlay funds to support the construction phase for 10 continuing projects
- Reduction of \$200 million for deferred maintenance included in the 2022-23 budget

- ◆ Effective January 1st the rate for Oregon Exchange students has been reduced from \$138 dollars a unit to \$69 dollars a unit.
- ◆ Effective summer 2023, all Non-Resident students who take 6 or fewer units during any semester will only be charge \$46 dollars a unit.



## Fees

- ◆ Reduced rate of our Oregon Exchange Program was emailed out with the attached flyer to all COS students. The flyer and an accompanying letter were also emailed or mailed out to 42 Oregon High Schools.



- ◆ We created an ad and mail in postcard for the 2023 Veteran's Education Guide. This guide goes all over the world to Military bases, educational services , and training centers. 7 of those base locations are in California.
