Donald Proby is a peacebuilder, and a diversity, equity, inclusion and belonging consultant. Donald holds consultancy positions with Community Boards of San Francisco, Coro of Northern California, the American Medical Association and Courageous Leadership, LLC. He has served as faculty at St. Mary's College of California, Drew University, as well as San Francisco State University. He recently served as Director for the Office of Mediation, Coaching, Ombuds, and Support Services for Brigham Health, where he instituted this new department, grounding it in leading edge practices, ensuring its sustainability and ongoing success. His work as an educator and practitioner has been focused on leadership development, conflict transformation, equity and belonging.

Donald has worked as a conflict transformation practitioner, mediator, leadership development educator, and facilitator of adult learning and transformative pedagogies since the 1980's. His work is firmly situated within the scope of restorative practices. He facilitates collaborative endeavors that are approached with mindfulness, embodied pedagogies

and appreciative action to support equity and belonging at all levels of engagement.
