Community services courses shall be open for admission of adults and of minors who can benefit from them, the programs. As these courses bear no credit, repeat enrollment is unlimited.

No General Fund monies may be expended to establish or maintain community services courses. Students involved in community services courses shall be charged a fee not to exceed the cost of maintaining the courses; however, additional material fees may apply in order to sustain these course offerings without incurring a debt for providing these services. Courses may also be offered for remuneration by contract or with contributions or donations of individuals or groups. Additional material fees may apply. Contributions need to be run through either the District or Foundation accounts for proper accounting and financial auditing purposes.
