Administrative Services

Facilities: Update on projects currently in progress.

- The new Fire Tower Prop Project Bid Phase has been awarded to Timberworks, a local contractor out of Mt. Shasta.
- Construction on the new Football Practice Field is underway. The ‘earthwork’ phase of the in-house project has begun.
- The Soccer Field Renovation Project is approaching completion of the ‘construction’ phase and moving into the ‘maintenance’ phase. After the maintenance phase has been completed (set for August 1), the field will be turned over to the College.

Fiscal Services: The Business Office welcomes Desiree Kaae to our department as the new Associate Director of Fiscal Services. Through at least the month of June, Desiree will be sharing roles between Administrative Services and Fiscal Services as she transitions into her new role.

As we approach the end of the 2020-2021 fiscal year end, a reminder to continue to review and clean up current year fiscal activity.

- Check budgets and expenditures. If there are any final budget or expenditure changes they need to be submitted using the approved form(s) to the Business Office. If you have any questions, email Desiree in the Business Office.
- Review any outstanding purchase orders to determine if the order is still outstanding. Invoices need to be billed/received prior to June 30. Contact Courtney in the Business Office to cancel any outstanding purchase orders or if there are any questions.

Some reminders:

- During the summer months while the campus is on a four-day work week, all approved payment vouchers must be submitted to the Business Office by 5 p.m. on Tuesday in order for them to be paid that week. With the shortened work week, the weekly accounts payable check run will be processed starting Wednesday morning in order to make payment by Thursday.
- Employees who would like to receive their paycheck via direct deposit can access the Direct Deposit authorization form through mySiskiyous/Employee/Pay. Once the form is completed submit to Human Resources.

Food Services: The kitchen is closed on the weekends in the summer. On-campus resident's nutritional needs are supported with healthy grab-and-go options they can purchase with their meal points.

Residence Life and Housing: Five student workers are helping this summer with cleaning and sanitizing the Lodge facilities between summer conferences and deep cleaning in preparation for fall resident's arrival. In early August, on-campus residents will select an arrival time to maintain social distancing similar to the fall 2020 process.

The Lodge summer conference schedule has added additional camps with two drum and bugle corps inquiring about using the college campus for training. Five summer conferences will use on-campus housing this summer.

Technology Services: The department will perform maintenance on the College's data network during the College closure on Friday, June 18 from 11 a.m. to 5 p.m. Within this period of time, the College's data network will be unavailable. Resources accessed through the Internet (such as email, Self-Service Banner, Canvas, and Zoom) will still be accessible but resources on the College's data network (such as Banner back-end) will not. Contact Tech Services with any questions or concerns.

The HappyFox ticketing system will be upgraded in July to support its adoption of Information Technology Service Management (ITSM) for its processes. This reconfiguration will allow the department to better monitor and report on how well it resolves issues and fulfills requests. The reconfiguration will create small differences in how tickets are submitted. More information will be provided as we move closer to the upgrade.

Student Services

EOPS/CalWORKs: EOPS staff have been busy processing End of Semester Progress check-ins and mailing gas vouchers and Grocery Outlet gift cards to students. The EOPS Counselors have also been busy helping students register for summer and fall classes.

The End of Semester Grants are being calculated and processed. Students who completed two Counselor contacts and two progress check-ins during the semester are eligible for this grant, and 91% of the spring 2021 EOPS students are eligible! Due to an Executive Order from the Chancellor's Office regarding COVID challenges for students, we were able to raise the grant award this semester from \$450 to \$650. We are hopeful this increase will help our students who may be struggling or dealing with extenuating circumstances brought on by COVID and the switch to online instruction.

EOPS is now accepting applications for the fall 2021 semester! Please encourage students to apply on the EOPS website: www.siskiyous.edu/eopscare/ and complete the "Application for Student Support Programs".

The CalWORKs program continues to provide its students with monthly gas vouchers as well as monthly check-ins to provide with assistance if needed. CalWORKs summer orientations have started and students receive a textbook voucher as well as a backpack full of school supplies and \$50 worth of gas vouchers.

Student Access Services (SAS – formerly known as Disabled Student Program and Services or DSPS): Student Access Services is recognizing student Brandy Hammond with a Certificate of Achievement for her tenacity in seeking and finding the career that is her life's calling. Brandy tried different programs before landing upon Early Childhood Education as the match for her interests, strengths and abilities. Brandy is also an advocate for students with disabilities and may very well end up on career that provides specialized services. For now, her general goal is to transfer to a university to continue her journey in teaching. Brandy is especially appreciative of the College of the Siskiyous for the supportive staff, service, and instructors. She said, "I've been to other colleges, and they were good too, but this is the first time that I know I'm going to succeed." She adds that "Nobody should be embarrassed to have a disability. At one point there was a stigma, but now there are services, and that's what the College of the Siskiyous represents... diversity and equality."



Two meetings have taken place with several innovative ideas explored and tasked to a small committee to follow up with.

The Nursing Program would like to also extend farewell and best wishes to Kim Parham, MSN, RN as she moves on to a new chapter in her life. Kim was a graduate of the COS LVN and LVN-RN Step-Up Programs and was a dedicated and highly respected colleague and instructor.
